Services are provided 5-7 days a week, dependent upon severity of need. This level of care is often used as a step-down from our Residential level of care or can be used as a starting point for treatment. In certain circumstances, Ambulatory Detoxification Services can be combined with this level of care. Individuals at this level of care will receive the full complement of treatment services we can provide.

INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT TREATMENT PROGRAM

This is a four to six week treatment program meeting three to four days a week for minimum three hour sessions for Adult Men and Women, including women who are pregnant. This level of care is designed for those individual requiring a significant level of treatment services to adequately address the severity of their addiction. However they do not require the intensity of an Inpatient or a Partial Hospitalization level. This may be a starting point for their primary treatment or also may be used as a "Step Down" from a higher level of care. In certain circumstances, a patient may also receive concurrent Ambulatory Detoxification Services for Opiate Withdrawal.

Whatever the reason for a woman's stay, the program's goal is to provide affordable housing in a safe environment with supportive services that promote self-sufficiency without regard to race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, sexual orientation, or disability. - Be a non-violent offender
